LIVE TO RUN AGAIN AUDIO BOOK LIBRARY EXCHANGE

Live to Run Again's Audio Book Libraries and Exchange (ABLE) will be set up at this trial.

ABLE is a free lending system of books-on-tape/CD that aims to help exhibitors stay awake while driving to and from dog events. Simply bring an audio book you've listened to and exchange it for one in the ABLE collection. Even if you don't have anything to exchange, feel free to pick up an audio book for your drive home. Prizes and Awards: Ribbons for qualifying rounds and ribbons for 1st through 4th place in each height division except the team relay class where 1st through 4th place shall be awarded in the mini and open divisions.

AAC ID Cards: All dogs competing in an AAC Trial MUST have their cards with them at the trial! Pending entries are not accepted. These cards are available from AAC. See enclosed form for details. The AAC dog registration application is also available at www.aac.ca

Move-ups: Move-up from Saturday to Sunday will be allowed. Move up forms must be completed and submitted to the Trial Secretary prior to the end of classes on Saturday. Move-ups from previous trials must be reported to the Trial Secretary at least one (1) week prior to the start of this trial.

Judges briefing and start of first class to immediately follow check-in each day.

Class Descriptions:

Regular Class:	These classes are open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current AAC rules.
Specials Class:	The Special class level shall be open to all dogs. A dog may no longer compete in the Regular class level once entered at an official trial in the Special class level; however, they are eligible for the Veteran class level.
Veterans Class:	This class level is for dogs seven (7) years of age or older. This class is also open to dogs five (5) years of age or older who have been competing in the Special class level for a minimum of twelve (12) months.
Standard Class:	This class demonstrates proficiency on all agility obstacles in a numbered course.
Gamblers Class:	This game demonstrates the handler's strategy and the dog's ability to work at a distance from the handler. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points as possible during the opening sequence and successfully complete the Gamble.
Snooker Class:	This game demonstrates the handler and dog's versatility as they work together against the clock. The object of this game is to accumulate as many points as possible in the opening and closing sequences within the allotted time.
Jumpers Class:	This game demonstrates a dog's natural jumping ability. The dog is required to complete a course comprised of jumps and tunnels as prescribed by the judge.
Team Relay Class:	This game demonstrates team spirit, strategy and sportsmanship. The course shall follow course guidelines for the Standard Class. Each dog/handler team shall run one section of the course.
Steeplechase:	This game demonstrates the dog's ability to run and jump at high speeds while maintaining control on the A-frame and weave poles. The class is open to all dogs eligible to compete in other AAC qualifying events at the Starters, Advanced and Master levels.

Additional information about the classes and title requirements is available in the AAC Rulebook, available online at www.aac.ca.

Notice to Competitors:

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of AAC Rules and Regulations, including but not limited to the following:

- This event is being held at a working horse facility and horses may be moving around throughout the day. Please keep your dog(s) under control at all times and away from the horses.
- This event is held under AAC rules and regulations and is open to all dogs at least 18 months of age, purebred or mixed breed, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance (judges' discretion).
- **All dogs must have an AAC number before their entries will be accepted in an AAC sanctioned trial, which must be produced at measure in. Dogs with numbers pending will not be eligible to compete.** Any dog without a card, under two years of age, or without two official measurements on their ID card must be measured before competing. A dog over 23" at the withers can have a signed ID card before two years of age.
- Competitors whose dogs measure up may run For Exhibition Only (FEO) if the dog is not prepared to jump the higher heights. No qualifying scores or awards may be earned.
- If you are sending entries by express carriers you **MUST** waive the signature requirement for receipt (make sure the carrier allows this), otherwise entries may not be received in time and will have to be rejected. **No phoned, faxed or emailed entries will be accepted.**
- Entry forms may be photocopied, but **MUST** include the entry form, agreement and signature in their entirety. A separate entry is to be submitted for each dog.
- Entries and payment must be received by the closing date. Hi-Flyers Agility Training reserves the right to refuse any entry for cause which they deem sufficient.
- Overpayments of \$10.00 or less will not be refunded.
- By AAC rules, entries are not valid until full payment of entry fees has been made. Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of entry fees shall be considered non-payment of entry. In addition, there will be a \$20.00 service charge for each returned cheque, regardless of whether the dog/handler compete in the event.
- After the closing date, refunds will only be given to competitors for bitches in season, providing a veterinarian's certificate is submitted. Refunds for any other reason after the closing date will be considered on a case-by-case basis and will be solely at the discretion of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reasons of riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, an act of public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. All refunds will be processed after completion of the trial. Refunds made will be less any AAC fees owing on the entry.

- Changes to entries (only for purposes of advancing to a higher class level) will be accepted in writing, via phone (204) 661-2234 or e-mail to ddenbow@mts.net up to one week prior to the trial, for those dogs that finished titles at shows held after the closing date. Changes will be accepted only for entries received by the published closing date.
- All entries will be confirmed via email only - where a valid address is supplied. If supplying an email address please ensure that it is valid and legible. If you don't have a valid email address and want your confirmation, please ask a friend to receive it for you.
- We will accommodate handlers running more than one dog to the extent possible. Running order will be determined at the clubs discretion. Any dog and handler not present for their run when their name is called will be ineligible to run, unless prior arrangements are made with the gate steward.
- No leads, collars, food, toys or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time. Toys and food shall not be permitted within 10 feet of the ring. Please be considerate of competitors and refrain from using clickers or squeaky toys while a dog is in the ring.
- All dogs must be penned, crated or leashed when not in the ring, and may not be tied to any obstacle, permanent or temporary anywhere on the grounds of the trial site. Dogs are not to be left unattended unless appropriately crated. Please take responsibility for your dogs and children. Any exhibitor whose dogs or children create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour may be asked to leave the trial site. There will be no refunds for entries if an exhibitor is dismissed from competition for any reason.
- Competitors must keep the crate and exercise areas clean. Please pick up after yourself and your dog.
- You may leave belongings at the show site, **at your own risk. Note: Overnight kenneling/camping is NOT permitted at the trial site, doing so puts the future use of this facility at risk and is grounds for dismissal from the trial.**
- **PLEASE NOTE: Abuse, in any form, of the volunteers, competitors or the judges will NOT be tolerated. Anyone disrupting the trial due to poor sportsmanship or abusive behaviour will be DISMISSED from the Trial, no fees will be refunded, and any legs earned to that point will be null and void. Let's remember that this sport is FUN for the dogs, competitors, judges and volunteers!**

Directions to Show Site:

PineRidge Equine Park (www.pineridgeequinepark.ca) is located just east of Winnipeg.

From the North side of Winnipeg:

Take Highway 59 North approximately 6 kms.

- Turn right (East) onto Garven Road. Continue on for approx. 2 kms
- Turn right (South) onto Highway #207. Continue on for approx. 3 kms.
- Turn right (West) on Oakwood Road for approx. 1 km.

From the South side of Winnipeg:

- Take Highway 15 (Dugald Rd) East of Winnipeg.
- Turn North (left) on Highway 207 just after crossing the Floodway.
- Drive (approx. 6.5 kms) to Oakwood Road (after the second set of railway tracks but before you ascend the hill) and turn left (West) for 1 km.

The huge building on your left is the PineRidge Equine Park arena. Parking is in front of the building.

<input type="checkbox"/>	Ring Steward	Reset bars when they are knocked down or at jump height changes, reset tunnels And straighten the chute as needed.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Leash Runner	Take leash from the start to the finish line.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Scribe Sheet Runner	Take scribe sheets from the scribe to the score table.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Scribe	Records faults or other marks on scribe sheet as indicated by the judge.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Timer	Use the electronic timers to time a run – very simple operation, pretty much press a Button and it does it all for you, read off time to scribe at end of run.
